Apprenticeship levy - policy change needed

Internal training preferred to apprenticeships – English and maths barriers

Joined up qualifications

Standardised job titles and roles – common job descriptions

MSiP / CHiPS / Mooring - transferrable skills

Future fuels – how do we train for it?

CSCS cards (skills passport) – get something similar for ports / shipping – national competency levels

Bring in right level for right role – don't need to know everything

Induction needs to be strong – understand how their role impacts – speak to communities and schools
