
Serious and Organised Crime





TRAIT AGNOSTIC: What are we looking for?

Not Profiling it's for behaviour indicators:

When observing people – remember... indicators for human trafficking are based on behavioural activities (*if it does not look right it probably isn't*) not a person's race, gender, sexuality or ethnicity



Organised crime gangs rely on people remaining silent!



Dutch Organized Crime Monitor

2019

Human trafficking awareness sessions delivered by NGO (*Invisible Traffick*)

Within 3 months:

- 8 observations raised to Police (PSNI)
- 8 arrests: 2 of which interrupted international chain of serious and organised crime gangs





Objective

- 2 people stopped
- 1 incident (suspected HT)

2019 – training starts

- 10 people stopped
- 6 incidents

2020 – COVID, incomplete stats

- 9 people stopped
- 8 incidents
- 9 arrests

2021 - COVID, no stats recorded

- 42 people stopped
- 19 incidents
- 38 arrests
