Level 2 Marina and Boatyard Operative Apprenticeship



Marinas and boatyards support key areas of the leisure marine industry. Marina and Boatyard Operative apprentices will train in a variety of operations including boat handling such as lifting and launching, pressure washing off, storage of boats ashore and berthing and movement according to company policy. They will become conversant with relevant legislation including codes of practice and operation of marina equipment. Apprentices undertake ONE specialism in chandlery, fuelling, rigging or lock and bridge operation.

DELIVERY

Learning and training will be delivered in the workplace with occasional release to attend training or courses offsite at an approved centre. Each apprentice will be allocated a dedicated trainer throughout the programme who will visit the workplace periodically and conduct regular progress review checks with the apprentice and line manager.

Apprentices will complete a training record book to confirm competence in the required knowledge and skills. Off the job training must equate to at least 6 hours per week over the course of the programme.

ASSESSMENT

Apprentices will be assessed using a variety of methods including observation, witness statements and work products. At the end of the programme they will undergo a graded End Point Assessment (EPA) conducted by an external assessor.
